GROUNDWATER INVESTIGATION, MONITORING AND REMEDIATION IN THE SOUTHERN PLUME AREA, DEFENSE FUEL SUPPORT POINT NORWALK, 15306 NORWALK BOULEVARD, NORWALK, CALIFORNIA (SCP NO. 0286B, SITE NO. 204DM00)

Dear Mr. Defibaugh:

Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) Norwalk facility, operated by Defense Energy Support Center (DESC), is a 50-acre facility consisting of 12 aboveground storage tanks that previously stored and distributed jet propellant (JP)-1 and JP-8. Kinder Morgan Energy Partners, L.P. (KMEP) leases a 2-acre easement along the southern and eastern boundaries of Defense Fuel Support Point (DFSP) Norwalk facility for operation of its pipelines that convey gasoline, diesel, and jet fuel. Under the oversight of Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board), both DESC and KMEP have been conducting environmental investigations, monitoring, and cleanup at the subject site.

Regional Board staff has been monitoring the data trend of subsurface groundwater quality beneath the subject facility and vicinity. The persisting increasing of petroleum constituents, especially benzene, has been observed in well GMW-O-14, located in the southern plume. Since the observed increase in contaminant concentration is beneath a residential area, you must take the following actions:

- Collect soil vapor samples according to the State of California Department of Toxic Substances
 Control guidelines at 5 feet and 15 feet depth at and around the monitoring well GMW-O-14 and
 submit data by April 31, 2010. The data should be compared to the previously collected soil vapor
 results and any screening levels such as California Human Health Screening Levels (CHHSL).
- 2. Re-conduct your a human health risk assessment completed previously for the site using the updated collection of site data, including soil, soil vapor, and groundwater quality, geological and hydrogeological setting, to re-evaluate the human health risk for the receptors on and near the facility, including the local residents. You shall submit the findings of your human risk assessment for our review by July 1, 2010.
- 3. Install a vapor monitoring network in the residential areas to monitor the soil vapor at soil depths of 5 feet and 15 feet below ground surface. You shall submit a work plan for vapor monitoring network for our review by **June 1, 2010**.
- 4. Evaluate the effectiveness of the current remedial measures and discuss the increase of benzene concentration from the monitoring well GMW-O-14 by April 31, 2010. If the current system is not effective, a revised remedial action plan (RAP) is required. The revised RAP must include cleanup goals for all the detected contaminant of concerns in soil, soil vapor, and groundwater released from KMEP's pipeline, valves, or other facilities. The revised RAP must also include proposed treatment technologies to cleanup and abate the effect of your contaminant release, as well as mitigation

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measures for plume containment, vapor intrusion control, etc. You must submit your revised RAP for our review by **June 1, 2010**.

 Investigate any potential new leaking from the pipelines operated by KMEP that might have contributed to the recently observed increase in contaminant level in the groundwater. You shall submit a tracer testing report for our review by July 1, 2010.
